Kershaw, Dodgers agree to \$215M deal

A person familiar with the deal says pitcher Clayton Kershaw has agreed to a \$215 million, seven-year contract with the Los Angeles Dodgers, a deal that makes the two-time Cy Young Award winner baseball's first player with a \$30 million average salary.

The person spoke on condition of anonymity Wednesday because the agreement had not yet been announced.

Kershaw receives the most lucrative deal for a pitcher, breaking the mark of \$180 million set by Justin Verlander last March for his seven-year contract with Detroit.

The average salary of \$30.7 million tops the previous high of \$27.5 million, set by the New York Yankees' Alex Rodriguez as part of a 10-year agreement December 2007.

Vikings hire Mike Zimmer as head coach

EDEN PRAIRIE, Minn. (AP) — The Minnesota Vikings will hire Cincinnati Bengals defensive coordinator Mike Zimmer as their new head coach, according to multiple media reports.

Zimmer will replace Leslie Frazier, who was fired after the team finished 5-10-1 this season. Zimmer will be the ninth head coach in the franchise's 54-year history, according to reports that emerged Wednesday.
