LMC women stay perfect in conference

LANSING — The Lake Michigan College women's basketball team defeated Lansing Community College 67-50 on Saturday to stay unbeaten in MCCA West Division action.

DeYahna Styles and Nicole Decker each scored 15 to lead LMC (5-0, 14-3). Sarah Huffman added 12 points and nine rebounds for the Red Hawks, who are ranked No. 14 in the NJCAA Division II poll.

LMC was nearly perfect at the free throw line, making 15 of 16 attempts.

La Tonya Shade scored a game-high 17 points to lead Lansing.

Lions hire Ron Prince to coach tight ends

ALLEN PARK, Mich. (AP) — The Detroit Lions have reunited Ron Prince with coach Jim Caldwell.

The Lions hired Prince on Saturday to coach tight ends and gave him an additional title of assistant head coach under Caldwell. He was Rutgers' offensive coordinator last season.

Prince was the Indianapolis Colts' assistant offensive line coach during the 2010 and 2011 seasons — when Caldwell was the

team's coach — and had the same job with the Jacksonville Jaguars in 2012.

He led Kansas State from 2006-08 with a 17-20 record. Prince has also been an assistant coach for the New York Giants, Atlanta Falcons and Washington Redskins and at Virginia, Cornell, James Madison, South Carolina State and Alabama A&M.

E. Michigan rolls past C. Michigan 72-59

MOUNT PLEASANT, Mich. (AP) — Mike Talley scored 21 points in helping Eastern Michigan get past Central Michigan 72-59 on Saturday.

Karrington Ward mastered the paint for the Eagles, pulling in 15 rebounds and scoring 15 points in the victory.

Eastern Michigan (11-6, 3-1 Mid-American) entered the second period with a four point advantage, 25-21 over Central Michigan as both teams had problems hitting the basket in the first half, especially from the 3-point range.

Eastern Michigan led 44-37 with 11 minutes to play, when the Eagles pulled off a 7-0 run over the next 30 seconds highlighted by six Talley points, upping their lead to 51-37.
