### Coates, Napier lead LMC men to victory

MUSKEGON — Ken Coates had 20 points and six assists, and Roy Napier added 17 points and four steals to lead the Lake Michigan College men's basketball team to a 66-62 road win over Muskegon Community College on Wednesday.

LMC (1-1 MCCA West, 9-6) trailed for much of the game before pulling ahead late and leading by as many as eight. Muskegon (0-2, 8-7) rallied to within three before Napier came up with some key steals to help secure the win for the Red Hawks.

"Roy had a real solid game," LMC coach Doug Schaffer said. "He had some key buckets and played real well defensively, too."

T.J. Scott scored 10 points for LMC. Terrell Clinton had 10 rebounds and Loren Johnson added seven assists.

### LMC women breeze past Muskegon

MUSKEGON — Behind a double-double from Lexi Hobbs, the Lake Michigan College women's basketball team cruised to a 69-51 win over Muskegon Community College on Wednesday.

Hobbs scored 18 points and pulled down 13 rebounds in the Red Hawks' win.

LMC (2-0 MCCA West, 11-3) took a six-point lead into halftime and coasted the rest of the way.

DeYahna Styles scored 14 points as well as collecting four assists, and Lacorsica Metts scored 13.

### Tigers agree to 1-year deal with Iglesias

DETROIT (AP) — The Tigers have agreed to a one-year deal with short-

stop Jose Iglesias that pays him at an annual rate of \$1.65 million while in the major leagues and \$1,237,500 while in the minors.

Iglesias, who is not yet eligible for salary arbitration, received the maximum 20 percent cut from his previous contract, an \$8.5 million, four-year agreement.

Iglesias finished second in last year's AL Rookie of the Year vote, hitting .303 in 109 games with Boston and the Tigers. Detroit acquired him from the Red Sox in a three-way deal shortly before the trade deadline.

Iglesias replaced Jhonny Peralta at shortstop for Detroit while Peralta was serving a drug suspension last season. Peralta signed with St. Louis during the offseason.

Iglesias is part of an infield the Tigers hope will be improved defensively in 2014. Miguel Cabrera is moving from third base back to first to replace Prince Fielder, who was traded to the Texas Rangers.

### W. Michigan opens MAC play with victory

KALAMAZOO — Western Michigan shot 60 percent from the floor on its way to an 87-76 victory over Toledo on Wednesday in its Mid-American Conference men's basketball opener.

The Broncos shot 68 percent in the first half, building a 47-33 halftime lead.

Connor Tava led Western Michigan (1-0 MAC, 8-5) with 25 points and Austin Richie scored 19. Lawrence graduate Shayne Whittington had 10 points and a team-high 10 rebounds.

Justin Drummond led Toledo (0-1, 12-2) with 18 points.
