BH walking tour slated for Saturday

BENTON HARBOR — A walking tour of historic sites in downtown Benton Harbor will take place Saturday, the Morton House Museum announced.

The tour, which takes about 45 minutes, will be led by local historian Chuck Jager.

Attendees are to meet in front of Water Street Glassworks shortly before 1 p.m.

The tour is sponsored by the Morton House Museum in conjunction with its exhibit "Lost Benton Harbor," which highlights the historic Benton Harbor buildings that have been torn down. The cost for the walking tour is \$5 and includes a tour of the exhibit at Morton House Museum.

LMC program earns accreditation

BENTON TOWNSHIP — Lake Michigan College's radiologic technology program has earned continued accreditation from the Joint Review Committee on Radiologic Technology.

LMC's is the only accredited radiologic tech-

nology program in Southwest Michigan.

After earning their degrees, radiologic technology graduates sit for the licensure exam, and an average of 98 percent of LMC graduates pass the licensure examination on their first attempt.

Twenty-five students are enrolled in the program annually and are trained in medical imaging lab on the Napier Av-

enue campus. The program incorporates classroom and lab work, as well as clinical training in local hospitals and other health care facilities.

The Joint Review Committee on Radiologic Technology is the only agency recognized by the U.S. Department of Education for the accreditation of educational programs in radiography.
