COLOMA — State Rep. Al Pscholka will host a public meeting Tuesday regarding odors from the Orchard Hill Landfill, his office.

The meeting will be at 7 p.m. at the North Berrien Senior Center, 6648 Ryno Road in Coloma.

Pscholka said representatives from the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality will be there to discuss progress made to alleviate odor complaints.

“Much progress has been made since our first town hall in May, but we are still working to address each and every residents’ concerns about the landfill odors,” said Pscholka, R-Stevensville.

RIVERSIDE — The Hagar Township Board on Monday is slated to take up a rezoning request to permit a Dollar General store along M-63, Supervisor Isadore DiMaggio said.

The meeting starts at 7 p.m. in the Township Hall.

He said the general merchandise chain wants to build a 9,500-square-foot building at the site of the former Vitale’s Market. He said Vitale’s operated there despite residential zoning. He said the town-

ship Planning Commission voted 5-0 last week to recommend the rezoning, though several residents objected to the idea.
