### LMC men lose on the road to Kellogg

LaBradford Sebree scored 22 points, but the Lake Michigan College men's basketball team fell on the road to Kellogg Community College 65-63 Monday night.

The RedHawks (6-1 MC-CAA, 15-5) made a second-half push after trailing by seven at the half, but came up short.

Kellogg hit a baseline 3-pointer with less than 10 seconds on the clock to hold on to the win over the RedHawks, who saw their seven-game win streak ended.

Alec Brown added 19 points for the RedHawks.

### LMC Women slide past Kellogg

The Lake Michigan College women's basketball team, behind some big shots down the stretch, pulled out a 79-74 win over Kellogg Community College on Monday.

After losing a 10-point lead and falling behind by one, the RedHawks' Sabrina Trujillo hit a corner 3 and a pair of free throws to put LMC (6-1 MC-CAA, 14-6) ahead for good.

"You look for positives in games, and we didn't play our best but I was very pleased with how we gathered and were able to pull out a win," LMC coach Jason Cooper said.

Trujillo led LMC with 20 points with Nicole Decker and Madison Cameron each scoring 14.

The RedHawks led 36-32 at halftime.

### Blizzard postpones MSU-Rutgers game

PISCATAWAY, N.J. (AP) — The Big Ten Conference

men's basketball game on Tuesday between Michigan State and Rutgers has been postponed by a blizzard that is threatening to bring 2 feet of snow to New Jersey.

Rutgers officials on Monday did not know when the game would be rescheduled.

New Jersey Gov. Chris Christie declared a state of emergency and closed state offices as the National Weather Service warned of a "crippling and potentially historic blizzard" expected to hit portions of the state Monday into Tuesday.

### Albuquerque, Tigers agree at \$1,725,000

DETROIT (AP) — Relief pitcher Al Albuquerque and the Detroit Tigers have agreed to a one-year contract for \$1,725,000.

Albuquerque would earn a \$12,500 bonus under Sunday's deal if he appears in 75 games as a pitcher this year.

The 28-year-old righthander was 3-1 with a 2.51 ERA in 72 games last year for the AL Central champions. He made \$837,500 last season and had asked for \$2.05 million this year. The Tigers had offered \$1,375,000.
