LMC men's hoops tops Siena Heights

The Lake Michigan College had a complete team effort in its 93-71 win over the Siena Heights junior varsity team Tuesday night. All 13 players on the roster scored for the Red Hawks (8-2).

Terry Davis Jr. led all scorers with 22 points for LMC and Michael Bush added a double-double with 13 points and 12 assists. Ja'Mare Washington also chipped in 11 points and seven rebounds.

Bears' Bennett put on IR due to rib injury

LAKE FOREST, Ill. (AP) — Chicago Bears tight end Martellus Bennett will miss the rest of the season because of a rib injury.

The Bears placed Bennett on injured reserve Tuesday, ending his third season in Chicago and ninth in the NFL.

With Bennett out, the Bears signed former Arizona and Cleveland tight end Rob Housler. They also announced that offensive tackle Tayo Fabuluje has been removed from the reserve/suspended by the commissioner list.

Bennett, the team leader with 53 catches, has been dealing with the rib injury the past few weeks. He missed the win at Green Bay on Thanksgiving and was limited during Chicago's overtime loss to San Francisco on Sunday.

Lowe, Tigers complete \$11M, 2-year contract

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — The Detroit Tigers

have completed an \$11 million, two-year contract with reliever Mark Lowe, adding a setup man for new closer Francisco Rodriguez.

A 32-year-old righthander, Lowe was 1-3 with a 1.96 ERA for Seattle and Toronto this year, striking out 61 in 55 innings. He did not allow a run in 49 of 57 appearances.

Tigers general manager Al Avila says "Mark solidifies the back end of our bullpen."

Lowe is 9-24 with a 3.80 ERA and six saves in 10 big league seasons, also pitching for the Seattle Mariners (2006-10), Texas (2010-12), the Los Angeles Angels (2013) and Cleveland (2014).

He gets \$5.5 million a year with the Tigers.

Auguste, Jackson lead ND past Stony Brook

SOUTH BEND (AP) — Zach Auguste had 23 points and 11 rebounds and Demetrius Jackson 19 points and 10 assists to lead Notre Dame over Stony Brook 86-61 on Tuesday night.

All five starters scored in double figures for the Irish, including V.J. Beachem, who finished with 14 points and was 4 of 8 from 3-point range.

Notre Dame (6-2) won its second straight game after dropping two of three in the Advocare Invitational in Orlando, Florida, to close out the month of November.

This was the first game in six days for the Irish since winning at Illinois, 84-79, in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge on Dec. 2.
