### LMC men's basketball falls to Jackson

BENTON TOWNSHIP — The Lake Michigan College men's basketball team lost to Jackson 73-63 at home on Wednesday. Michael Bush led the Red Hawks with 15 points and nine assists in the loss.

Lake Michigan College (1-1 MCCA West, 11-4) allowed Jackson (1-1, 10-5) to shoot 52 percent from the floor.

Christian Littlejohn and Charles Lawler each scored 14 points for Jackson.

Behind Bush, Jason Walter scored 14 for LMC and Terry Davis added 11. Forward Ja'Mare Washington pulled in 10 rebounds.

"I give credit to Jackson for coming in here and playing a really solid game," Red Hawks coach Doug Schaffer said. "They executed well on the offensive end and their defense gave us troubles all night. I'm proud of our effort in the second half, but we just didn't make enough plays on both ends of the court to come back tonight."

### E. Michigan beats C. Michigan 99-80

MOUNT PLEASANT, Mich. (AP) — Raven Lee scored a season-high 32 points on 10-of-13 shooting, including 5-of-7 from 3-point range, to lead Eastern Michigan past Central Michigan in the Mid-American Conference opener for both teams Wednesday night.

James Thompson IV, Willie Mangum IV and Jordan Price scored 19 apiece for Eastern Michigan (9-5), a career-high for Price. Thompson grabbed 14 rebounds.

Lee and Thompson scored five each during a 11-3 run that put the Ea-

gles up 71-61 midway through the second half. They led by at least seven thereon.

The Eagles hit 13 3-pointers and shot 65 percent — both season highs — from behind the arc. They came in averaging 5.1 made 3s per game and shooting just 26.6 percent from deep.

Josh Kozinski scored 18 and Braylon Rayson had 17 points for Central Michigan (7-7). Chris Fowler and Rayshawn Simmons scored 13 apiece. Simmons had nine assists.

The Chippewas had their seven-game home win streak snapped.

### Jackson leads Pistons past Celtics 99-94

BOSTON (AP) — Reggie Jackson scored nine of his 24 points in the final quarter, Kentavious Caldwell-Pope finished with 20 and the Detroit Pistons rallied for a 99-94 win over the Boston Celtics on Wednesday night.

Andre Drummond was in early foul trouble and had an off night for the Pistons, scoring 13 points and grabbing five rebounds.

### Blackhawks beat Penguins 3-1

CHICAGO (AP) — Rookie Artemi Panarin scored two goals for the second straight night, and the Chicago Blackhawks beat Pittsburgh 3-1 on Wednesday for their second win against the Penguins in two days.

Panarin broke a 1-1 tie when he jumped on a loose puck after a faceoff and whipped it over the glove of goaltender Marc-Andre Fleury at 8:56 of the third. Teuvo Teravainen added an empty-net goal.
