### LMC men defeat Ancilla on Saturday

PLYMOUTH, Ind. — Terry Davis had 21 points and eight rebounds to lead the Lake Michigan College basketball team to a 77-70 victory over Ancilla College on Saturday.

Michael Bush added 12 points and 11 assists for LMC (6-3 MCCA West, 16-6). Arsenio Arrington scored 13, and A.J. Gibson came off the bench to make three 3-pointers and score 11 points.

Tre'Shon Heard lead Ancilla with 16 points.

### Admirals drop close game to Danville

ST. JOSEPH — The Lake Michigan Admirals lost 103-101 to the Danville Riverhawks on Saturday in Premier Basketball League action at Michigan Lutheran High School.

The Admirals (2-3) lost to Danville (4-3) for the second straight night. They had a chance to win at the buzzer, but Ian Walcott's 3-point shot rolled off the rim.

Darren Washington had a triple double for the Admirals with 13 points, 14 rebounds and 11 blocks. Jon Graham added 19 points and 12 rebounds, and Kareem Story contributed 17 points and 10 boards.

Frank Williams led the Riverhawks with 24 points.

### Notre Dame beats Wake Forest 85-62

SOUTH BEND, Ind. (AP) — Zach Auguste had 21 points and 12 rebounds and Demetrius Jackson added 14 points in his return to the starting lineup as No. 25 Notre Dame defeated Wake Forest 85-62 on Sunday.

V.J. Beachem added 15 points for the Fighting Irish (15-6, 6-3 Atlantic Coast Conference).

Jackson, who missed a game with a pulled hamstring in a win over Boston College last week, added eight assists and seven rebounds. Notre Dame's leading scorer missed Thursday's loss to Syracuse.

Devin Thomas had 19 points and eight rebounds for Wake Forest (10-11, 1-8), which never led. The Demon Deacons have lost six in a row.

### Snedeker closes with 69 before delay

SAN DIEGO (AP) — Brandt Snedeker closed with a 3-under 69 on Sunday in raging weather at Torrey Pines, and then had to wait to see if it would be enough to win the Farmers Insurance Open.

And that could take another day.

The final round was suspended for the third time because of gusts that topped 40 mph. Jimmy Walker was at 7-under par and led by one shot over Snedeker and K.J. Choi. Walker and Choi still had eight holes to play.

Snedeker was done at 6-under 282.

Chad Campbell, who shot a 79, played with Snedeker and called it one of the greatest rounds he has seen.

The numbers back that up. The scoring average Sunday was just over 78, and Snedeker was the only player to shoot par or better.

### NHL's Bettman signs deal through '22

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — A person familiar with the situation says NHL Commissioner Gary Bettman has signed a contract through 2022.

The person spoke to The Associated Press on Sunday morning on condition of anonymity because the NHL didn't announce the move.

Bettman has been the league's leader since 1993 when it had 24 teams. Now, it has 30 franchises and there may be one or two more in a couple of years.

The NHL has had three lockouts under Bettman. Labor strife eliminated the 2004-05 season and shortened the 2012-13 and 1994-95 seasons. The current collective bargaining agreement with the NHL Players' Association expires in 2022, the same year Bettman's latest contract ends.
