SOUTH BEND (AP) -John Lattner, the 1953 who helped lead Notre Dame to a 9-0-1 record and 15 and John Simons 11.

a No. 2 ranking in Frank Leahy's final year as coach, has died at 83.

His death was confirmed Saturday by Notre Dame.

Lattner, a two-time All-American, was a halfback, defensive back, punter and kick returner who edged Minnesota's Paul Giel for the Heisman.

Lattner was drafted seventh overall by the Pittsburgh Steelers and played one season.

C. Michigan can't hold on against Ball St.

MOUNT PLEASANT (AP) — Bo Calhoun scored 22 points while grabbing 14 rebounds and Ball State pulled away late in the second half for a 75-63 win over Central Michigan on Saturday.

In a close game, Ball State (16-9, 7-5 Mid-American Conference) took the lead for good with the first of two free throws from Calhoun, which came during a decisive 8-0 run that made it 65-58 with 2:56 left.

Rayshawn Simmons' layup cut the gap to five, but Ball State then got a 3-pointer from Francis Kiapway to spark a 10-3 run to the final buzzer.
