## LMC men's basketball beats No. 1 Lansing

BENTON TOWNSHIP — Lake Michigan College's men's basketball team pulled off a major upset Friday night, coming from behind 10 points at halftime to beat Lansing Community College in overtime 91-80. Lansing entered the game as the top-ranked team in the NJCAA Division 2 poll.

"To say this was a great win would be an understatement," said LMC coach Doug Schaffer. "The second half was a classic example of gradually chipping away and finding a way to make it a one possession game and the overtime session was all LMC."

The Red Hawks (8-3 MCCAA West, 18-6) took control in the extra period, outscoring Lansing 14-3. LMC had the lead 77-76 with 15 seconds left in regulation after Michael Bush hit one of his four 3-pointers.

Lansing (8-2, 20-3) held a 32-10 lead with eight minutes left in the first half, but then the Red Hawks began to cut into the lead, eventually closing the gap at halftime to 44-34. Terry Davis (28 points, 11 rebounds) and Arsenio Arrington (19 points, 14 rebonds) each had doubledoubles on the night. Bush finished with 22 points and five assists.

The LMC women's team easily defeated Lansing, 77-42. Complete results were unavailable.

## Akron trips up Central Michigan

AKRON, Ohio (AP) — Freshman Josh Williams hit six 3-pointers and scored 22, both season highs, and Antino Jackson added 18 points on 7-of-9 shooting to help Akron beat Central Michigan 92-87 Friday night.

Reggie McAdams scored 14, Noah Robotham had 13 with a careerbest eight assists and Isaiah Johnson added 12 points for the Zips (19-4, 8-2 Mid-American Conference), who have won six in a row.

Akron hit five of its season-high 16 3-pointers during a 22-1 run that gave the Zips a 20-point lead with 8:24 to play.

Central Michigan (13-10, 6-4) used an 11-2 run to pull within nine about four minutes later and a 15-6 spurt.
