Doug McDermott finished with 20 points and Paul Gasol had 16 points and 17 rebounds for the Bulls.

Blackhawks trade for Kings' Ehrhoff

CHICAGO — A day after the Blackhawks traded for Andrew Ladd, they kept making moves before Monday's trade deadline and dealt defenseman Rob Scuderi to the Kings for defenseman Christian Ehrhoff.

The Hawks acquired Scuderi, 37, in December in a trade with the Penguins for Trevor Daley but Scuderi, who played in 17 games for the Hawks, struggled to get on the ice after the All-Star break. The Hawks placed him on waivers and then sent him down to Rockford Feb. 17.

The move would seem to be more about next season than this one for the Hawks considering Scuderi's contract runs through next season and Ehrhoff, 33, is an unrestricted free agent after this season.
