## No. 2 Irish women roll past Duke in ACC

GREENSBORO, N.C. (AP) — Freshman Marina Mabrey scored 14 points to help second-ranked Notre Dame beat Duke 83-54 in Friday's quarterfinals of the Atlantic Coast Conference tournament.

Fellow rookie Arike Ogunbowale also scored 14 for the top-seeded Fighting Irish (29-1), who shook off a slow start to build a double-digit lead by midway through the second quarter on the way to an easy win. Notre Dame led by 15 at halftime and by 31 from there.

Notre Dame improved to 55-1 against ACC opponents during that time, including 7-0 in the league tournament. The Fighting Irish advanced to play No. 21 Miami today.

Azura Stevens scored 19 points to lead the eighth-seeded Blue Devils (20-12).

## Trio charged with assault on freshman

PHILADELPHIA (AP) —Three senior football players at a suburban Philadelphia high school have been charged with assaulting a freshman with a broom handle on what the team called "No Gay Thursday," a prosecutor announced Friday.

Three 17-year-old students at Conestoga High School held down a 14-year-old boy on Oct. 15 and penetrated him with the broom handle while he screamed, Chester County District Attorney Tom Hogan said.

After the charges were announced, longtime head football coach John Vogan was suspended from all coaching duties pending the outcome of an investigation.

Vogan did not immediately respond to a request for comment.
