NC State-UNC game postponed due to ice

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. (AP) — Winter weather and potentially dangerous road conditions have led to the postponement of Saturday night's rivalry game between No. 14 North Carolina and North Carolina State until Sunday.

UNC athletic director Bubba Cunningham said in a statement that school officials "are not comfortable with the idea that thousands of people ... would be leaving the arena tonight after 10 p.m."

The decision came despite No. 8 Duke hosting Boston College in nearby Durham despite the poor weather.
