LMC women's basketball routs GRCC

BENTON TOWNSHIP — The Lake Michigan College women's basketball team had little trouble beating Grand Rapids Community College 74-46 on Wednesday night.

The Red Hawks (11-2 MCCA West, 19-5) held a 39-20 halftime lead, with Hailey Maas scoring a game-high 20 points with seven rebounds and two assists.

Kelsee Kinder added another 18 points and had six assists, while Haley Madison earned a double-double with 10 points and 12 rebounds.

Grand Rapids Community College (4-9, 11-12) was led by Allazae Lloyd with 12 points.

Grand Rapids was led by Jeffery Draketodd, who had a game-high 26 points.

Row the Boat line now at Minnesota

KALAMAZOO (AP) — "Row the Boat" be-

longs to P.J. Fleck.

The Minnesota football coach and his former employer, Western Michigan, reached an agreement Wednesday that will give Fleck legal intellectual property of the catchphrase he made famous in four seasons with the Broncos.

As part of the deal announced by Western Michigan, Fleck will make a yearly gift of \$10,000 to the school to support a football scholarship. The Fleck Family Football Scholarship will begin this fall.

The school says it will be allowed to use "Row the Boat" in materials "recognizing and celebrating Fleck's tenure at WMU and the teams he coached."

Royals sign ex-Cub Wood to 2-year deal

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) — The Kansas City Royals have signed left-handed pitcher Travis Wood to a two-year contract, with a mutual option for the 2019 season.

The deal is worth \$12 million, a person familiar with the negotiations told The Associated Press on condition of anonymity earlier this week.

The 30-year-old Wood made a career-high 77 appearances with the Chicago Cubs last season, posting a 4-0 record and a 2.95 ERA. He held lefties to a .128 average.

A 2013 National League All-Star, Wood spent the last five seasons with the Cubs after arriving in a trade with Cincinnati in 2011.
